

At a recent circuit meeting of Niagara area pastors I asked, "How is the LWML important to your mission as a congregation?"

There was some silence from a few pastors but there also were some very encouraging words spoken.

One pastor said, "I love that everything they do is related to missions."

Following up with those words another pastor said, "Yes. They are the only church group that is focused solely on missions."

At this point another pastor said, "The priorities of the LWML gets everyone else in the congregation thinking about sharing Jesus."

Please do not be surprised to find that pastors do not all agree on the role of the LWML in the congregation. Some of the pastors were silent when I asked this question. One pastor said, "Don't even

ask me that question." He responded as if he had a lot to say but did not want to open that faucet. While pastors may respond differently to the LWML in their congregation, I do not think any pastor would respond negatively when hearing the purposes of the LWML. "The mission of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League is to assist each woman of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod in affirming her relationship with the Triune God so that she is enabled to use her gifts in ministry to the people of the world."

I simply cannot imagine a pastor opposing a woman who wanted to be in a relationship with the Triune God. I simply cannot imagine a pastor opposing a woman being enabled to use her gifts in ministry to the people of the world.

The second part of the mission statement is not about supporting or enabling women serving in the Office of the Holy Ministry. It is about enabling a woman to live within the promise of her baptism, that she is a child of God. While I cannot imagine opposition to these purposes I know that women in the Eastern District do in fact struggle to elicit support from their pastor.

A word of encouragement to women in the Eastern District from your Junior Pastoral Counselor: If you believe that the LWML is not receiving support from your pastor...talk to him. Outline ways that the LWML supports the mission of the congregation. Give specific suggestions for ways the pastor could more effectively support the work of the LWML. Many frustrations we all may have in our congregations are best reconciled when we speak directly with the people involved.





ONGOING PROJECT -- CLIPPED, CANCELLED POSTAGE STAMPS



The clipping and saving of cancelled postage stamps for the Canadian Bible Society is ongoing. The enthusiasm and response from our people in the Eastern District has been wonderful! The approximate amount for 2007, mainly from the Pittsburgh Zone --from which Deaconess Nancy Lingenfelter gathers-- has been 57 pounds. However, the approximate total of stamps gathered since mid-2003 (from the Pittsburgh Zone) has been 322 pounds. Accumulated stamps from the other zones, added to that amount would obviously increase the total. This means that for every one pound of stamps that has been sold (for now \$5.00 per pound) 322+ Bibles have been made by

the Canadian, as well as the American Bible Societies and distributed to various countries, often in the respective "native language." What a tremendous resource for spreading God's precious Word about the Savior's love and redemption for all.

Please continue to save the various "first class" postage stamps --NO pre-sorted or bulk rate ones-- then clip (leaving at least 1/4 inch around the edge -- a must!) and BRING then to any of the various LWML gatherings throughout the year --like Joy Shops, Rallies, Retreats, Conventions, meetings, etc.

The Canadian women, with whom Deaconess Nancy has been in contact and receives the stamps from her, have been most appreciative of the efforts and commitment of our Eastern district people with this project and THANK YOU for the time, effort and support.

UNITED WITH HIM

"If we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His." **Romans 6:5 (ESV)**

Historically, there has always been a connection between the celebration of Easter and the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. In the early Church candidates for Baptism were usually baptized as part of the Easter Vigil. This was not done as a result of mere coincidence or for the sake of convenience; it was deliberately arranged this way to demonstrate the close connection between the Sacrament of Baptism and the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus.

The connection is this: In Baptism we have been united with our Lord and Savior in His death and resurrection, which means that each day we experience a spiritual death and resurrection of our own. Every day we die to sin because in Baptism we have been crucified with Christ. The Easter Epistle for this year puts it in these terms: "You have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God" (Colossians 3:3). Because we have been baptized into the death of Christ, sin and all its en-

ticements should mean nothing more to us than they do to a corpse.

But our union with the Crucified doesn't leave us dead and buried, because He was not left dead and buried. Because He rose from the dead and lives again, we too rise from the death of our sin to live the New Life in Christ--a life characterized by good works motivated by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. While our good works do not have any influence in our standing before God (which is determined solely by His grace), they are nevertheless important because they give testimony to the whole world concerning the power of the Gospel in our lives. In short, our good works show others that the Gospel of Christ has made a difference in our lives. On the other hand, a steadfast refusal to do good works is in essence a steadfast denial and contradiction of our Savior's resurrection.

During this very special time of the year for the Church we celebrate the great mysteries of the faith: Christ has died and risen again. That's not just an old story. It's a story that happens again every day in your life if you have been baptized into Christ. May the crucified Christ be revealed in your forgiveness and may His resurrection be proclaimed in your works--especially as you share the Good News with others for whom He died and rose again!

Women and their children may live for up to six months at Sojourner House where shelter and basic needs are provided. A structured schedule, shared household responsibilities, family style dinners and enforced accountability are all contributing factors to help these families form lasting habits to change their lives.

ATTENTION ZONE AND SOCIETY PRESIDENTS STATISTICS – LET'S MAKE THEM REAL!

Zone Presidents were provided a sample form recently from VP of Communications Katharine Rickus as a <u>reminder that</u> <u>National LWML will be wanting certain statistics from the</u> <u>Eastern District in early 2009 for the National LWML Convention Manual</u>. Zone presidents will need to give a count of zone events during the period July 2007 through June 2009 (with estimates for the latter 6 months). This will include a count of rallies, seminars, workshops, prayer services, zone retreats, servant events, etc.

Society Presidents will need to provide their zone presidents when contacted for the same time period above with the number of active LWML members. In addition, National wants to know the total number of women involved if others help or participate in society LWML activities.

Every two years it seems to get more difficult to get an accurate accounting of "active" societies and members within our Eastern District, let alone in all of National LWML. If a society provides mite box offerings through their Zone Treasurer, who forwards them to the District, they should be considered "active" and so listed in our ED LWML Directory. Better yet, if their members actually meet during the year and participate in zone and district activities, as well as contribute mite offerings, they would be considered really active!

It's up to Zone Presidents to make the distinction between "active" and "inactive" societies as far as the ED LWML Directory listings are concerned and should notify Kathi Rickus of any changes in this regard.





NEWS FROM THE 2008 EASTERN DISTRICT CONVENTION



Mission Grants

Ten mission grant proposals were presented to the delegates at the Eastern District convention Friday evening in Rochester, New York. On Saturday morning delegates voted to fund the following projects in this order:

- 1. **\$3000** to provide 650 men and women in the armed forces with Christian devotional materials for one year. LCMS World Mission
- 2. **\$2800** for advertising and materials for a youth/after school center in Philadelphia, PA. Christ Memorial Lutheran Church
- 3. **\$2000** for Bibles, books and materials, and tape players for Community Lutheran Ministry Reading & Readiness Program for Tots. Pinnacle Lutheran Church
- 4. **\$1500** for Lutheran Campus Ministries on the Niagara Frontier for materials, Bibles, and food. Katharine Rickus.
- 5. **\$5000** for Camp Restore Victim Aid fund in New Orleans to supply building materials for families who cannot afford to rebuild. Buffalo Zone LWML
- 6. **\$4000** for materials and advertising for a church plant in the Ridley-Interboro area of Delaware county, PA. Philadelphia Lutheran Ministries
- 7. **\$1500** for sewing supplies and materials for turbans and for Christian literature and Bibles to be distributed at two local oncology centers. Grace Lutheran Church, Vestal, NY
- 8. **\$2006** for a one year academic scholarship for one girl to attend Siyathemba Girls' High School, South Africa. LCMS World Relief and Human Care
- 9. **\$3653** for 500 Chinese language Bibles and Small Catechisms to reach people in China with the Gospel. LCMS World Mission

Voting resulted in 3 ties. Project 1 will be paid first. Projects 2 and 3 were tied and will be paid when there are sufficient mites to fund both. Another tie occurred with projects 4 and 5; therefore they will also be funded when sufficient mites become available for both. The last tie was for projects 8 and 9, which will both receive partial funding, when grants 1 - 7 have been paid.

Giving generously to your mites, and turning them in often will enable the grant recipients to receive their funding and carry out their missions. Treasurers can help by sending in mites monthly. May God bless all of you as you share His gifts with others!

Thank you for allowing me to serve in Mission Advocacy and Grants for the past four years. It has been a very rewarding experience that I shall always treasure. I have been blessed through this work and by all of you!





Lutheran Churches in the Buffalo and Niagara areas have worked hard at sewing quilts, putting together kits, and buying soap. 
