I was recently purchasing fabric for 200 turbans and was vacillating over whether we could afford that last 5 yard bolt. I had discussed with the clerk what we were making and how we were low on funds. Thinking aloud I said "The Lord has always provided, I'll take that last 5 yards." The woman behind me in line stepped forward and announced "I'll pay for that 5 yards". The woman then confided that her 32 yr. old son , Chris was battling brain cancer. We added his name to our prayer list. The Lord provided. He provided people to pray for Chris, support for his mother, encouragement for those of us sewing, and hopefully inspiration for you. Please continue to keep this ministry in your thoughts and prayers.

In the classic Easter text from Jeremiah 31 we are taught by God that He will makes His people dance with joy on account of His saving work. "You shall adorn yourself with tambourines and shall go forth in the dance of the merrymakers." (Jeremiah 31:4b) We associate dancing with some of the most joyful, fun and special moments in our lives: school events; evenings out with friends; weddings, etc. It is hard to be sad when you are dancing! Life is good when the music flows and it is time to celebrate. Do you remember that Jesus intends for that lightheartedness to be our overall approach to life?

This life is sometimes spoken of as a "veil of tears." It is true that we have some bad days. Sometimes it can seem unbearable. We wonder at points how we ever got into such a mess as this! 




It seems that several people have wondered why the color purple is associated with the LWML. A request was sent to Barbara Huggins who works at Concordia Historical Institute, who sent the following reply based on research into the files and materials that are there:

In Gladys' file of firstS it states and I quote "It was reported in the Southern Illinois Lutheran Woman's Quarterly Supplement for October of 1948 that their district had adopted the colors of old. Purple symbolizes royalty and gold symbolizes value and integrity." No scripture reference

purple and gold. Purple symbolizes royalty and gold symbolizes value and integrity." No scripture reference was given.

I also found a reference on page 77 of the book Wings the note that the Executive Board adopted as LWML Colors purple and gold in 1951. At the executive board meeting held on July 24, 1951 at the 20Commodore Hotel New York, New York the minutes state "motion was made by Mrs. Emil Frank to recommend that the colors Purple and Gold as suggested in the Handbook, be adopted as the official League colors. Action – Adopted. The date you want for the first use would be the October 1948 but official adoption by the league as a whole July 1951. A handbook was produced at the time and it states the colors.... No reason or biblical reference is given.

> JOB DESCRIPTIONS—(These are general descriptions the complete job description can be obtained from any of the Nominating Committee.)

Reports to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors; serves as chairman of the Nominating Committee; oversees the preparation of the Convention Manual, helps the president in appointing members to serve in appointed positions, and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.



WOW! The 2009 Portland LWML convention was most uplifting convention that I ever attended. From the moment I stood in the auditorium for the banner processional practice to the closing of the convention I was reminded that if we Look to the Hills - God Reigns. He truly reigns in each of our lives. This was my last convention as your President. I thank you for the opportunity to represent the Eastern District . In his sermon during the convention's opening worship service, **Rev. Dr. Warren** Schumacher spoke about God's reign and the rain garden on the rooftop of the Oregon Convention Center that captures nine acres of falling water. "God does rain on us abundantly, but here it is usually softly, slowly, and tenderly. ... Turn your umbrella upside down and catch the blessings." Delegates to the 33rd Biennial Convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) adopted a \$1.825 million mission goal for the 2009–11 biennium. It is the largest in the organization's 67-year history and will fund a record 19 mission grants. More than 3,200 people attended the convention, held in Portland, Oregon, June 25-28, under the theme "Look to the Hills ... God Reigns," based on Psalm 121:1-2 and Isaiah 52:7. The LWML is the women's auxiliary of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, the second-largest Lutheran denomination in North America. Fall is the time of year when the minds of all good Lutherans think of hot cinnamon cider, pumpkins and the Lutheran Reformation. Yes, the Reformation! We can't help that images of Luther's seal appear in our heads. We begin to hum the tune to *A Mighty Fortress is our God*. The Reformation is the defining moment in history for us. It is our heritage. During this important time in church history our church leaders reached into the Scriptures and, paying careful attention to the example of the ancient church, rediscovered God's grace for all humankind.

Our lives are in pieces. God is whole. We walk in the darkness of a fallen world collapsed upon itself. God is pure light. The philosophies of this world are based on foolishness. God is true wisdom. By God's grace alone, apart from our deeds, we are being transformed from what we were to what He is - pure, holy, righteous and loving. By God's grace, without any need for our abilities, we are being re-shaped into the image of God! This is done by the Spirit-filled Word of God that accomplishes exactly what is says it does. God says you are forgiven? Let there be no doubt – it's true. God says He gives you eternal life? It's a done deal. God says He has adopted you as His child? It's an absolute fact.

Sometimes it seems that the biggest problem for us is not wondering whether or not God can actually do all He says, but that He actually has done all that for us. We are sinful. We often do not have in mind the things of God. Our lives are easily filled with trouble, with most of it brought upon us by our own doing. We suffer from depression, addictions and broken relationships. We give in to temptations and knowingly break God's commandments. The fires of pride and arrogance are easily kindled in our hearts. How could the holy, powerful, eternally transcendent Divine Creator of all things so willingly give all those wonderful gifts to us? It is by His grace alone. After all, God is Love (1 John 4:16), and it is His nature to love us so. We do well to understand that the heart of God is love. After all, He provides us with all the fruits of His creation: The apples for the cider; the cinnamon we add to it as a flavorful spice; the pumpkins that become one of our favorite pies. He also provides us with the fruits of His new creation: The washing away of our sin; the water of His Spirit poured into our hearts; citizenship in God's eternal Kingdom of Light. These are the gifts that God bestows upon us by His grace.

A pastor once gave me a good example about church life. One of his members came to the back door of the parsonage and began to knock. In the man's arms was a large grocery bag. The pastor opened the door and greeted the parishioner. "Good morning, pastor!" the man replied. "I brought you a bag of fresh tomatoes. Our garden is doing very well this year and we have more than we can use." "That was very nice of you." said the pastor, taking the bag from the man. "I appreciate this very much!" After he had closed the door, he placed the bag of tomatoes on the kitchen counter next to several other large bags that were full of dozens of tomatoes that had previously been delivered by other church members. "You'll never be able to use all these tomatoes!" I replied. "True," he said, "But it is much better to graciously accept a gift like this than to reject it. I will surely be able to give some of these tomatoes to other people who can use them!"

I commend the action of this pastor to you as an example of how to receive the gifts God gives us by His grace. Willingly accept what Jesus brings to you until your life overflows with His forgiveness and love to the point you have enough even to share with those around you who also need what God has to give.


