DISMISS YOUR SERVANT IN PEACE!



Luke 2:25-32

Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying: "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all people, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

This is, of course, the song of Simeon after having held Jesus in his arms for the first time. I would like you to ponder the life of Simeon, as well as Anna. How long they both had to wait for what Simeon calls "the consolation of Israel." That is the fulfillment of prophesy, the coming of our Lord and savior Jesus Christ. But it wasn't just them; consider Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham, Phinehas, David and Jeremiah. To each of these God rendered a covenant, the promise of God's grace, the hope of everlasting life. Simeon and Anna got to hold Jesus, but to each of these the covenant was nothing more than a distant promise.

Consider what each of these men had to live through. Adam and Eve witnessed murder, the life of one son at the hands of another. Abraham witnessed Sodom and Gomorrah, Lot being carried away into captivity, and the tension that existed between Hagar and Sarai, based upon jealousy. Phinehas saw the men of Israel indulging in sexual immorality with the Moabite woman. David saw no end to violence, such as Goliath, Saul, Amnon, Absalom, the Ammonites and the Amalekites, not to mention his own sin with Bathsheba and the murder of Uriah the Hittite. Jeremiah suffered through the siege of Jerusalem, and the seventy year captivity of Israel.

Consider your own life, what have you seen, endured, witnessed and lived through? Have you ever had to deal with loss, failure, sickness, death, rejection, addiction, abuse, or who knows what else? Life isn't easy, it is full of injury and abuse, yet despite all of that, God's promise is true. While the external evidence would seem to point to destruction and disaster, the consolation of Israel and the salvation of all mankind is even closer now than it ever was before.

In Luke 21 the disciple speaks of earthquakes, famines, tidal waves, pestilences, war and persecution, but then he says: "When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." Trial and adversity are not the signs of destruction but redemption. It is unfortunate but true that more suicides are committed during the holidays than at any other time in the year. It is a time when we often look back and remember those who have gone before, but do not let the losses get you down, your redemption is only just around the corner. Remember Jesus promise, "if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." It is time to rejoice! Therefore, may the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen!

I am planning on setting up an Eastern District LWML Facebook account in the near future as another way to get the new out. I will announce the launch on the web site, so be sure to bookmark the website!

Below are some important reminders related to the LWML Quarterly and the Eastern District LWML Directory. Please take a moment to read through them as a reminder.

LWML QUARTERLY SUBSCRIPTIONS: It's time to review the LWML Quarterly subscriptions. In January, I will send the Zone Presidents and Treasurers a list of the societies/individuals that receive Quarterlies. I am asking them to contact each society (or individual) in their zone to confirm the information concerning the number of Quarterlies a society receives and to make sure the mailing address for the LWML Quarterly is correct. After each zone has verified their lists, I am requesting that they return the confirmed list to me. The deadline for submitting these lists is **MARCH 1, 2013**. **Decreases** in LWML Quarterly subscriptions can be made only once a year, and the deadline to do that is April 1, 2013. **Increases and changes of address** can be made anytime during the year. You can mail a Subscription Order Form to me at the address below. All payments should be sent through the Zone Treasurers (see below).

LWML QUARTERLY PAYMENTS: Societies/individuals are still asked to send in their donation for the LWML Quarterly to their **Zone Treasurer**. The rate for the LWML Quarterly is set by the Eastern District LWML Board of Directors and is currently \$8.00 per subscription for less than 10 copies to the same address and \$6.50 per subscription for 10 or more copies to the same address. This rate includes the cost of the Quarterly plus a \$1.50 contribution towards the cost of the Eastern District LWML LINK newsletter. One copy of the LINK is sent to Society Presidents in care of the congregation unless the president has requested the LINK editor to mail it directly to her home. Society Presidents are asked to share the District LWML LINK with their members either by making copies available or posting a copy at church. The LINK can also be used to glean LWML news to include with church publications. **Important Fact**: These donations enable the District to use your mite box offerings more effectively for mission grants!

DIRECTORY CHANGES: To keep the Eastern District LWML Directory up-to-date please send me all changes to names, addresses, phone numbers and emails of pastors, society presidents, and zone officers to me as soon as possible. Directories are published in February (even numbered years) March (odd numbered years) and are distributed at the Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings. By sending the changes as soon as they occur allows me to keep the Directory up-to-date.

Job Descriptions

(For complete descriptions, contact Linda Bahr)

President—oversees the work of the Eastern District LWML including presiding at the District LWM Convention and meetings of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee. She is responsible to appoint various committee members to the Board of Directors and sign payment vouchers. She keeps in communication with her Board to make sure all necessary decisions are being made, and visits and helps promote the work of the LWML among the Zones of the Eastern District. She also attends National LWML Board meeting when requested and National LWML Conventions. And other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Vice President– Human Care—May perform the duties of the President in the absence of or request of the President. She must attend Board of Director and Executive Committee meetings. She is the coordinator of the Human Care. She is responsible for issuing membership charters to new societies; reports to the executive committee and Board of Directors, and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Vice President Gospel Outreach/Organizational Resources—May perform the duties of the President in the absence of or request of the President. Coordinates the Gospel Outreach/Organizational Resources Department. She must attend Board of Director and Executive Committee meetings. She reports to the Executive Committee and Board od Directors; serves as chairman of the Nominating Committee, oversees the preparation of the Convention Manual, helps the president in appointing members to serve in appointed positions, and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Treasurer—Attend all Board of Director and Executive Committee Meetings. Be bonded at the expense of the District LWML; receive deposit slips and monthly reports from the Financial Secretary; receive and deposit all other money in bank approved by the Executive Committee; keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements; make all payments as authorized; serve as chairman of the budget committee; submit records for financial review annually; and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Counselor—Attend all Board of Director and Executive Committee Meetings. Serve the District LWML in an advisory capacity; attend all District LWML Conventions, attend the National LWML Convention as directed by the Executive Committee; submit articles to the Editor for publication in the Eastern District Newsletter; submit a written report for the Convention manual; serve as the spiritual leaders for the Board and Executive Committee and help with services at retreat and convention when possible; and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

The shelter has room for up to 12 people and includes a playroom for children, bed rooms for adults, rooms that can accommodate families and a handicapped accessible room on the 1st floor. Marty shared that the group had recently acquired a house next to the homeless shelter that will be used as transitional homes for men in order to "break the chain of homelessness" God has blessed this ongoing mission which serves as an example of knowing of a need and finding a way to meet it in Christian service.



COUNSELOR'S 1 Corinthians 13

LOVE!



¹ If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. ² And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. ³ If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. ⁴ Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. ⁸ Love never ends. As for prophe-

cies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away. ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰ but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. ¹¹ When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. ¹² For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known. ¹³ So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

This is, of course, a familiar verse of Scripture, but a less familiar word is love. While there are five different types of love in the Bible, the type of love spoken about here is "agape." This particular type of love appears only nineteen times in the Septuagint (a Greek translation of the Old Testament). While there are many different kinds of love in Greek, 1 Corinthians 13 uses the word (agape). This is a type of love that only God is truly capable of, but Christians long to emulate. According to our text Love is patient and kind, not envious or boastful, not arrogant or rude, not insistent, irritable or resentful. Notice it does not say that it will never arouse such emotions in others. Genuine love is rarely appreciated, and often abused; hence we often fear genuine communication. Have you ever told a child "no", or tried to explain our communicant policy to those of a different faith? It is seldom appreciated, but essential to their health and wellbeing.

Scripture teaches us that we are only capable of genuine love, in that God has first loved us. And the greatest example of God's love for us is to be found upon the cross of Calvary. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that who so ever believeth in Him shall not parish but obtain eternal life" (Jn. 3:16). Love is the one thing that makes sacrifice possible and the only thing that truly gives sacrifice meaning. It is love that holds a church together and drives those pointless disputes away, it is love that can hold a marriage or a family together, and it is love that will hold the Lutheran Woman's Missionary League together.

We are a family, sisters in the faith, children of God, and the bride of Christ. It is love alone that can hold us together; with love nothing can tear us apart. "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." Everything else will pass away but love never dies. So long as we truly love one another, and allow our love to shine before others, people of all ages; this world will never destroy us. "Love your neighbor as yourself." Now, may the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen!

LWML QUARTERLY SUBSCRIPTIONS: Updates, including decreases, to LWML Quarterly subscriptions were sub-



mitted on April 1, 2013. The end result was an increase of single subscriptions (32 to 33) and a decrease in multiple subscriptions (841 to 780). The total number of subscriptions decreased from 873 to 813. I have been informed of several mistakes, so please make sure that any other issues are brought to my attention so they can be corrected. As a reminder, decreases in LWML Quarterly subscriptions can be made only once a year, and the deadline to do that is

April 1. Increases and changes of address can be made anytime during the year. You can mail a Subscription Order Form to me at the address below. All payments should be sent through the Zone Treasurers (see below).

LWML QUARTERLY PAYMENTS: Societies/individuals are still asked to send in their donation for the LWML Quarterly to their **Zone Treasurer**. The rate for the LWML Quarterly is set by the Eastern District LWML Board of Directors and is currently \$8.00 per subscription for less than 10 copies to the same address and \$6.50 per subscription for 10 or more copies to the same address. This rate includes the cost of the Quarterly plus a \$1.50 contribution towards the cost of the Eastern District LWML LINK newsletter. Important Fact: These donations enable the District to use your mite box offerings more effectively for mission grants! One copy of the LINK is sent to Society Presidents in care of the congregation unless the president has requested the LINK editor to mail it directly to her home. Society Presidents are asked to share the District LWML LINK with their members either by making copies available or posting a copy at church. The LINK can also be used to glean LWML news to include with church publications.

DIRECTORY CHANGES: To keep the Eastern District LWML Directory up-to-date please send me all changes to Directory names, addresses, phone numbers and emails of pastors, society presidents, and zone officers to me as soon as they are known. We just didn't have the 500+ volunteers we were planning to get.

She reports to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors; serves as chairman of the Nominating Committee, oversees the preparation of the Convention Manual, helps the president in appointing members to serve in appointed positions, and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Treasurer—Attend all Board of Director and Executive Committee Meetings. Be bonded at the expense of the District LWML; receive deposit slips and monthly reports from the Financial Secretary; receive and deposit all other money in bank approved by the Executive Committee; keep an itemized account of all receipts and disbursements; make all payments as authorized; serve as chairman of the budget committee; submit records for financial review annually; and other duties as set forth in the Leader's Manual.

Ecclesiastes 3:10-17 (NIV)
"10 I have seen the burden God has laid on the human race. 11 He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end. 12 I know that there is nothing better for people than to be happy and to do good while they live."

Last weekend at Camp Pioneer we had a chance to be refreshed. We saw how important is it to be connected and stay connected to that sense

of spiritual dryness so that we can appreciate all the more when God quenches our dried up, sinful lives. 

"Wounded Warrior" - Putting on the Whole Armor of God Eph. 6: 10-24



Grant 3 received \$5000 for LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces for materials and training for Operation Barnabas in the Eastern District. This grant was facilitated by Rev. Alex Knowles of Camp Pioneer and Bob Forester from the Eastern District Office. Pastor Knowles wishes to thank the LWML for all their support on this project. Rev. Knowles worked with Bob Foerster and the Ministry to the Armed Forces in



preparing for the 2 events that were funded by the LWML grant.

Goal of the Project: Sensitize congregations to the unique ministry needs of returning warriors and their families (in their congregations and in their communities), and, encourage and equip them with tools to proactively meet those needs.

Conference Summary: Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) is a debilitating anxiety disorder resulting from exposure to



a major trauma involving death or the threat of significant injury. The pastors of the New York Regional Conference and the Pennsylvania Regional Conference invited Lieutenant Colonel Stephen Hokana, a clinically trained hospital chaplain with a specialty in spirituality and post-traumatic stress disorder to bring his 25 plus years of military service and his astute grasp of the topic to their respective conferences: May 7th and 8th at Canandaigua, NY and May 14 and 15 at Ligonier, PA.

Throughout his daylong multimedia presentation, Lieutenant Colonel Hokana outlined for our pastors what it is like for those

grappling with this life-unsettling disorder and gave education and encouragement to their ministry of support for afflicted individuals and their families. Attendees learned that ministry care givers need to remind those affected with this powerful anxiety disorder that the affliction is nothing to be ashamed of, that is does not go away on it's own, and that it demands the full attention of those suffering, their families and their caregivers to deal with it effectively.



Most clearly however, Chaplain Hokana, reiterated time and time again that this affliction can be overcome through God's grace, the Holy Spirit and a commitment to see the battle through.

Climbing the

Chaplain Hokana astutely stated to both audiences that whether PTSD resulted from a bomb blast or a tornado blast there is victory in Christ Jesus, who knows our heartaches and inner turmoil better than we ever could.

Measurement of Success: The most striking testimony to the powerful nature of Chaplain Hokana's presentation and the timely nature of the topic was the compete stillness in the conference room, the rapt attention of the pastors and the much larger than normal percentage of pastors who remained at the conference for the second day of presentation.

SCARVES FOR HAITI


